

# POOL RULES

1. Lifeguards are on duty for your protection. Do not distract them in any way. If you need to talk to the lifeguard, wait until he/she is away from their post.
2. NO prolonged underwater swimming or breath-holding games allowed.
3. NO playing around pool drains.
4. NO glass food/beverage containers will be permitted in the pool area under any circumstances.
5. NO large artificial floating devices – inflatable rings, lounge chairs, etc. – are permitted. Inner tubes or rafts are not allowed under any circumstances. If a pool patron requires the assistance of a large flotation device as a modification for a qualified disability, that patron will notify the lifeguard on duty of the need for such a modification. Personal flotation devices for small children/infants are allowed provided they do not jeopardize the safety of the individual wearing them or interfere with the duties of the lifeguard.
6. NO diving from poolside allowed into any part of the pool
7. NO children 12 years of age or under regardless of swimming ability are allowed in the pool area without parent or adult guardian. Parent/guardian must maintain visual contact with the child at all times.
8. NO running, horseplay, playing ball or tag games are allowed in the water, on the pool deck or clubhouse.
9. NO abusive or profane language allowed in the pool area.
10. NO radios or CD/Tape players can be brought in by patrons. Walkmans, MP3 Players, etc. with headphones are allowed. All portable electronic/electric devices must be kept away from the water. Wearing of portable electronic/electric devices while in the pool is strictly prohibited.
11. NO persons with sores, skin diseases, or bandages will be permitted in the pool.
12. Appropriate swimwear must be worn at all times. Small children/infants in diapers must wear swim diapers to prevent accidents. In the event of an accident the pool will be closed until it is cleaned.
13. Patrons must take a cleansing shower prior to entering the pool and wash their hands after using the restroom .
14. A parent or guardian must accompany and remain in arms length of any individual with known medical or physical conditions that could place them at higher than normal risk while bathing in the pool
15. The "Emergency Signal" for clearing the pool is three (3) BLASTS OF THE WHISTLE. When this signal is sounded, all swimmers must immediately leave the pool by the nearest ladder or pool edge.
16. For your safety the lifeguard may clear the pool once an hour for 10 minutes. If the lifeguard must use the 10 minute break to clean, adjust chemicals, check bathrooms, etc., he/she will direct pool patrons not to enter the pool until he/she specifically authorizes the pool patrons to reenter the pool.
17. The lifeguard is the absolute authority in all matters pertaining to the safety, operation and management of the pool.
